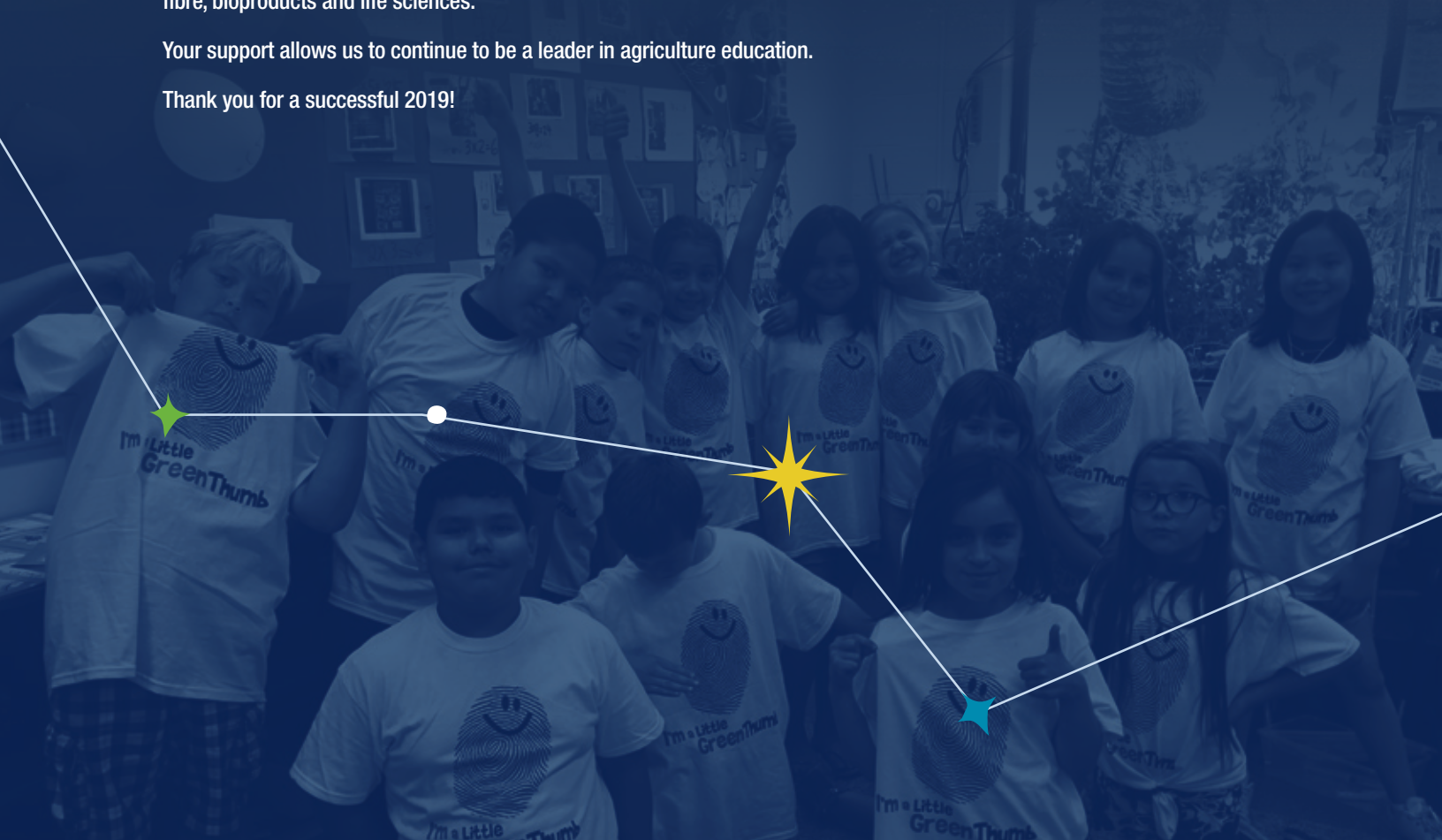
Leading the Way

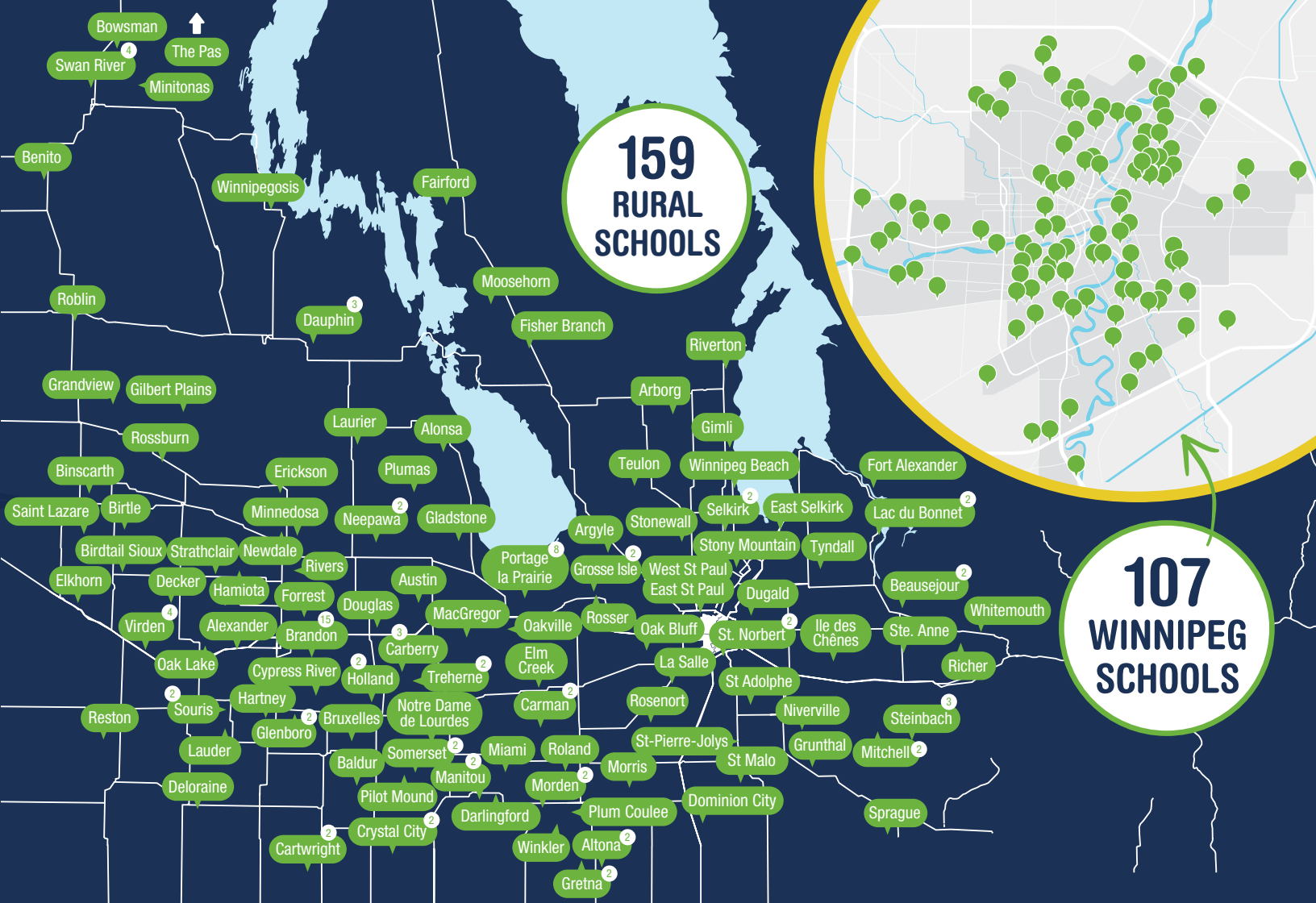

Bingo & Word Searches

This summer AITC-M staff had a lot of fun developing new printable activities for teachers to download from our website.

Our word searches were created under four agriculture-related themes: animals, careers, equipment and crops. The free downloadable activities are easy for teachers to print and ready-to-use. The word searches have been a huge hit, being our top downloads for 4 months in a row! They were introduced in August of 2019 and were downloaded 278 times by the end of the year.

Road Trip Ag Bingo was developed at the start of summer and promoted to all Manitobans, not just teachers and students. We encouraged people to download the three different printable cards to take with them on their summer road trips. The cards featured various agriculture-related sights seen from Manitoba highways and in towns. We also ran a contest with Crampton's Market to help market the Bingo to people outside of our immediate followers. The Bingo cards were downloaded 251 times last summer.

A Driving Force

Cheryl McQueen goes above and beyond when it comes to creating hands-on connections to agriculture and food in her grade 2 classroom at Victory School in Winnipeg.

Cheryl has had a Little Green Thumbs classroom garden for 7 years, providing students the opportunity to plant, grow, eat, and share their harvest all year round. The garden helps students learn where their food comes from and gets them excited about eating fresh produce. She loves getting creative with the garden and is constantly thinking up new ways to use it for further learning opportunities.

Cheryl takes time to discuss all the hard work that goes into agriculture.

Known as Victory School’s Compost Queen, with both outdoor composting and indoor vermicompost (worm) bins, Cheryl never misses an opportunity to educate students on the full food system and why it’s important.

Last fall, Cheryl tweeted photos her students created with a caption expressing why they are thankful for farmers using the hashtag #thankafarmer. This helped students appreciate where their food comes from and gave thanks to the people who grow it.

In BDO's letter to the Board of Directors of AITC-M, they concluded that "Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not

present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Agriculture in the Classroom – Manitoba Inc. as at December 31, 2019, and the result of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit enterprises."
